Structure Guide

◆ Paragraph 1 – Introduction

Say what you are doing this weekend **in general**.

Example:

This weekend, I'm doing several things with my family and friends.

◆ Paragraph 2 – Saturday Plans

Talk about your plans for Saturday.

Use expressions like:

- On Saturday morning...
- In the afternoon...
- At night...

Example:

On Saturday morning, I'm meeting my friends at the mall. In the afternoon, we're watching a movie. At night, I'm having dinner with my family.

◆ Paragraph 3 – Sunday Plans

Talk about your Sunday plans.

Example:

On Sunday, I'm visiting my grandparents. In the evening, I'm studying for my English test. I'm not staying home all day because I want to be active.
