This can be seen in the fantasies produced by science fiction writers in the middle of the twentieth century. Almost nothing has turned out the way that these writers expected. This means that science fiction written before 1980 now seems quite dated. What's more, scientists have even begun to ridicule the notion, fundamental to much science fiction, that one day we just might encounter intelligent aliens.
