After three consecutive weeks of unstable weather, farmers in Greenford Valley were under pressure to protect their crops without damaging the river that runs through the fields. Early in the season, the rainfall was unusually low, so the soil hardened and young plants struggled to develop deep roots. When the rain finally arrived, it came all at once. The river began to rise so quickly that the local council warned it might overflow if the banks couldn't hold.

Mara, who grows organic vegetables, refused to use strong pesticide even when insects attacked her plants. Instead, she used natural methods and focused on improving the soil. She explained that if the ground stays too compact, water can't drain properly, so she tried to loosen it carefully and reduce surface runoff. "If the water can soak in," she said, "it lowers the chance of flooding downstream."

By late summer, conditions improved. The cooler nights helped the plants recover, and Mara's winter squash started to grow larger than expected. When the harvest ended, the farm produced an exceptional crop—especially impressive after such a difficult start. Other farmers, who had relied heavily on chemicals, admitted that short-term solutions sometimes create long-term problems for the land.
