With the rise of Internet shopping, people have become used to being able to buy whatever they want whenever they want it, 24 hours a day, seven days a week. However, receiving your purchase after paying isn't always as quick. That is, until now...

We've all experienced it; finding the perfect gift or item online at a brilliant price, only to fall victim to delivery delays, long processing times and hold ups with couriers. **B** Such a service would make even next day delivery a thing of the past!

This is exactly what some online retailers are currently researching and hoping to provide via floating warehouses and drones. Although it sounds like something out of a science-fiction movie, the technology already exists and a viable system could be with us sooner than we think. But how would it work?
