Reading

Copenhagen, one of the world's happiest cities

After I spent a few days in Denmark's capital city, Copenhagen, I wasn't surprised to learn that the Danes are among the happiest people in the world and the city, one of the greenest. Could it be because less than 30% of households own a car and 55% of people in the city cycle to work or school every day? Perhaps it's because in Denmark, people love to create a friendly, warm and cosy atmosphere and enjoy the good things in life wherever they go. And they've certainly succeeded in doing so in Copenhagen. They even have a word for it, 'hygge' (pronounced *hoo-ga*).

In Copenhagen, it isn't difficult to find your very own 'hygge'. You can start each morning with a delicious sweet Danish pastry, such as a *boss snail* in one of the many colourful cafés in Nyhavn. Then why not take a boat ride around the harbour and along the quiet canals? You'll see a very different side to the city.

If you prefer to travel on land, getting around the city is both easy, healthy and eco-friendly if you use a bike. You can hire one from one of the city's many cycle shops or borrow one of the new electric 'smart' bikes that you'll find all over the city. There are over 350 km of cycle paths where cars are prohibited and it's been voted the best city in the world for cycling.

Visitors to Copenhagen must take a trip to Tivoli Gardens, which is the perfect place for either a quiet walk or something more exciting. There are the beautiful gardens filled with exotic plants and interesting architecture to see, as well as one of the world's oldest theme parks with rollercoasters both old and new. And if you go in the evening, thousands of coloured lights create an amazing atmosphere.

After a day's sightseeing, you'll probably be thinking about dinner and there's no better place to experience traditional Danish food and 'hygge' than at home with a Danish family. But don't worry if you haven't got any Danish friends as there's now a website that will introduce you to local people who will cook for you in their home. It's well worth it.

As well being a city for cycling, what makes Copenhagen one of the greenest cities in the world is what is happening away from the canals, the cafés and the gardens. Copenhagen gets very cold in winter, so to keep its population warm, it has a central heating system that supplies over 98% of homes with large amounts of renewable, clean energy.

Keeping cool in the summer is also important and recently, the city has developed a unique, central air conditioning system that uses the cold water from the canals and harbour to help do that.

So if you're looking for a green, healthy and happy place to visit where you're sure to find your 'hygge', you're going to love Copenhagen. I'll see you there!
