

Describing Household Problems

Using Past Participles as Adjectives

We use past participles to describe the condition of something.

- The window is **broken**.
- The sink is **clogged**.
- The wall is **cracked**.
- The fridge is **damaged**.
- The pipe is **leaking** (exception: present continuous form).

Using Nouns to Describe Problems

We can also use nouns:

- There is a **crack** in the wall.
- There is a **leak** under the sink.
- There is a **stain** on the carpet.
- There is a **hole** in the roof.
- There is **some damage** on the table.

Common Household Problems Vocabulary

broken – The chair is broken.

leaking – The pipe is leaking.

clogged – The toilet is clogged.

cracked – The wall is cracked.

stained – The carpet is stained.

scratched – The table is scratched.

torn – The curtain is torn.

damaged – The door is damaged.
