Greenland

1 Landscape

Greenland or Kalaallit Nunaat is noted for its vast tundra and immense glaciers. The world's largest island lies in the North Atlantic Ocean. Its size is more than three times the size of the U.S. state of Texas. Two-thirds of the island lie within the Arctic Circle, and the island's northern extremity extends to within less than 800 km of the North Pole. Greenland's deeply indented coastline is 39,330 km long, a distance roughly equivalent to Earth's circumference at the Equator.

Greenland's major physical feature is its massive ice sheet, which is second only to Antarctica's in size. The Greenland Ice Sheet has an average thickness of 1,500 metres, covering four-fifths of Greenland's total land area. The ice-free area may be a minority, but it's still around the size of Sweden.

2 Population

Although Greenland is big, it only has a population of 56,000 people. That means you'll run into 0.03 people per square kilometer. Of course, nobody lives in the vast majority of the country, but even then – there is plenty of room to be alone – even in the capital city Nuuk. About 89% of the population was born in Greenland, while 11% have immigrated from Denmark or other countries. Politically, Greenland is an autonomous part of Denmark and the Head of State is the Danish monarch.



3 Name

If Greenland is covered in ice, why is it called Greenland? Turns out, the exiled Viking – Eric the Red – came up with the name as a marketing ploy to encourage others to follow him to Greenland and establish new settlements there. That being said, South Greenland (where Erik the Red settled) is actually remarkably green during summer.

4 Housing

Do Greenlanders still live in igloos? Are there hotels in Greenland anyway? The first Inuit used snow, ice, stones, peat and skin to build their new accommodation. Today, there are many modern hotels in Greenland. Most people live in beautiful, colourful houses with all the amenities of a modern home. But Greenland offers some special ways for curious and adventurous travellers to spend the nights. You can choose between igloos, fantastic lodges with an extraordinary view of huge icebergs or you can stay in a simple trapper's cabin after joining a mini-sledding expedition in the Arctic winter.

5 Attractions

Greenland is one of the best places in the world to see the Northern Lights. With 24-hours' darkness during winter and very little light pollution, the Northern Lights dance brightly over Greenland. While they can be seen from anywhere, one of the best places is near Kangerlussuaq, which has more than 300 days of clear sky each year.

There are opportunities for awesome heli-skiing, ski touring, and ski mountaineering in Greenland. Greenland is a winter playground for skiers. Although there are only a handful of small downhill ski centres, some 2,000 m drops from mountain top to ocean attract heli-skiers and ski tourers from around the world.

In summer you can also go kayaking and even stand-up paddle boarding with whales in certain locations.

As you can see, a trip to Greenland will give you an insight into the Greenlandic culture. You will meet welcoming people who have lived in the Arctic for many centuries.
