

Figurative Language

Video of today's lesson.

Figurative language is a creative way of using words that do not mean their literal definition, designed to create vivid mental images. Some examples of figurative language are:

1. A simile compares two unlike thing using like or as.
Examples: The owl looks like a cat.
Angel is as gentle as a dove.
2. Metaphor - directly compares two things.
E.g. Angel is a dove.
3. Hyperbole - an exaggeration.
E.g. If I don't go to the mall tonight, I'm literally going to die.

4. Idiom - a phrase that is not literal.
E.g. It's raining cats and dogs.

5. Personification - giving objects human like traits.
E.g. The wind whispered in the wind.
6. Onomatopoeia - a word that sounds like what it describes.
E.g. Kaboom, boing

7. Alliteration - repetition of the same consonant sounds.
E.g. Ken kiss the cake.
8. Assonance - repetition of the same vowel sounds.
E.g. The rain in Spain falls mainly on the plain.
