Generation C will be nicer

Tomorrow's generation, or "Generation C," will be nicer, according to a report by the Social Issues Research Centre of Oxford, England. The study was undertaken to examine how the Internet is shaping our lives. It predicts that Generation C (standing for **content**, connectivity, creativity, collaboration, and communication) will be nicer to each other and more able to communicate with a wider variety of people.

Generation C, whose members will be **middle aged** by 2020, will have grown up under the Internet's principles of cooperation, exchange, and sharing of information. This knowledge will have strong yet positive consequences for society. The study also predicts a future with a greater **blurring** of real and virtual worlds, where the Internet and computer technology will



continue to blend into our daily lives to become a norm for everyone.

The study points out that the number of social networking sites is increasing rapidly. These include those that cater to special-interest groups and those that **unite** people separated by geography. These sites are

important because online relationships tend to be formed with people we do not normally come into contact with during our daily lives. This contact can broaden our horizons and increase understanding and tolerance among people from different backgrounds.

Although there is a **tendency** to focus on the Internet's negative implications, this study suggests that while there will still be problems, a more positive future lies ahead.

The Amazing Abilities of

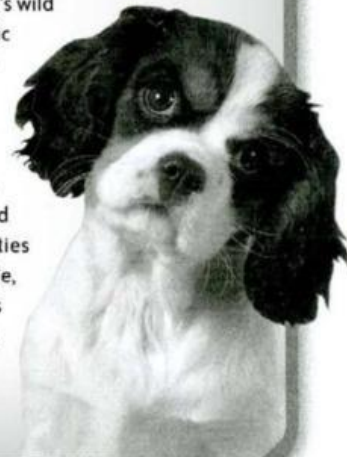
DOGS

Do dogs have a sixth sense? Yes, but perhaps not in the way that is generally assumed. There is nothing supernatural about canine sensitivities. They can all be explained by biological mechanisms, although it is true that we are only beginning to understand some of them.

For instance, dogs can find their way home from long distances. It has been said that this ability is based on the detection of subtle differences and changes in the earth's magnetic field. We are still learning how dogs achieve such remarkable navigational feats as have been objectively recorded time and again.

Dogs are also capable of predicting thunderstorms. When a storm is imminent, they may become intensely alarmed and begin whimpering and trembling as if in pain. Their distress increases when the thunder starts to boom, but it can be observed for some time before the storm actually breaks overhead. This sensitivity is a response to changes in barometric pressure. It may seem to be meaningless behavior today, but in the dog's wild ancestry, it made good sense to become worried by these climactic signals. For example, wolves go to a great deal of trouble to build their dens on slopes, perhaps to protect tiny pups from floods. It is possible that domestic dogs are acting out the behavior of their ancestors' response to the danger of flooding.

One of the most amazing claims for the dog's sixth sense was made recently by researchers who reported that they had discovered infrared detectors in the dog's nose. This could explain certain abilities previously thought to be supernatural. St. Bernard dogs, for example, are said to be able to tell whether a climber buried in an avalanche is still alive, simply by sniffing the snow. If there are sensitive heat detectors in the noses of animals, this theory is not so far-fetched. We know that they exist on the snouts of certain snakes, and this strengthens the case for their existence in dogs.
