A *Wilbur Wright, to his brother Orville (1901)* In 1901, the Wright brothers tried out their flying machine for the first time but were very disappointed when they didn't succeed. However, two years later, in 1903, they took to the skies and entered the history books. And only 18 years after Wilbur made his prediction, the first non-stop transatlantic flight was made from Newfoundland, Canada to Ireland by Captain John Alcock and Lieutenant Arthur Whitten Brown.
