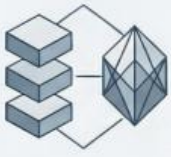


Impact of Educational Changes on PBD Instrument Development and Students' Social Mobility

Supporting Detail: Modern PBD replaces high-stakes examinations with a continuous ecosystem of written, behavioral, and oral evidence collection.



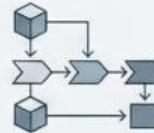
Transparent Design Reducing Hidden Social Advantages

Supporting Detail: Analytic rubrics and scaffolded tools democratize success by making performance expectations visible to students of all backgrounds.



Assessment as a Catalyst for Social Mobility

Supporting Detail: Focusing on soft skills like oral confidence and leadership provides "symbolic capital" essential for future interviews and employment.



From Product Measurement to Process Evaluation

Supporting Detail: Unlike traditional exams, PBD recognizes "process-sensitive" achievements, ensuring silent or struggling pupils are no longer invisible.
