



1. Read the text carefully and do the tasks.

The expression “on cloud nine” means very happy. For example, someone might say, “I passed my exam – I’m on cloud nine!” But where does this expression come from?

One common explanation is that the phrase comes from an old system for putting clouds into groups. According to Oxford’s Dictionary of Idioms, clouds were once divided into ten groups, and number nine was one of the highest. Because it was so high in the sky, “cloud nine” became a way to show extreme happiness. An older version of the phrase was “on cloud seven”, which also meant feeling very happy.

Another explanation comes from the US Weather Bureau in the 20th century. In this system, clouds were divided into groups, and each group had nine types. The ninth type was the highest cloud, so being “on cloud nine” meant feeling on top of the world or very relaxed and happy.

However, not everyone agrees with these explanations. Some language experts say that the origin of the phrase is not clear. They explain that early versions of the expression appeared in the 1930s, such as “on cloud eight”, and these were sometimes used to describe people who were drunk. Later, jazz singers helped make the phrase popular as a way to describe feeling “high”, either emotionally or because of alcohol.

Another possible reason comes from an American radio program in the 1950s called Johnny Dollar. In the show, a character was often hit and became unconscious, and people said he went to “cloud nine” while he was recovering. This may be one reason why the number nine stayed in the expression.

Over time, the meaning became clearer and more positive. By the 1960s, American dictionaries explained "on cloud nine" as completely happy. Today, the phrase is very common and is used to describe people who feel extremely happy
