Living in a modern **metropolis** brings both excitement and challenges. On the one hand, cities offer excellent **public amenities**. Residents have easy access to top-tier hospitals, international schools, and large **entertainment centres**. Getting around is also becoming more convenient. In many cities, the government has built **sky trains** and **underground** systems that are much more **reliable** than traditional buses, especially during **rush hour**.

On the other hand, urban life can be exhausting. One of the biggest problems is **traffic congestion**. Because roads are often narrow and the population is growing, streets are frequently **packed** with vehicles. This leads to high levels of car **exhaust**, which pollutes the air and causes health issues like **itchy** eyes. Furthermore, constant development means there is a **construction site** on almost every corner. While these projects bring new high-rise buildings, they also create a lot of noise and dust, making some neighborhoods feel like a "concrete jungle."
