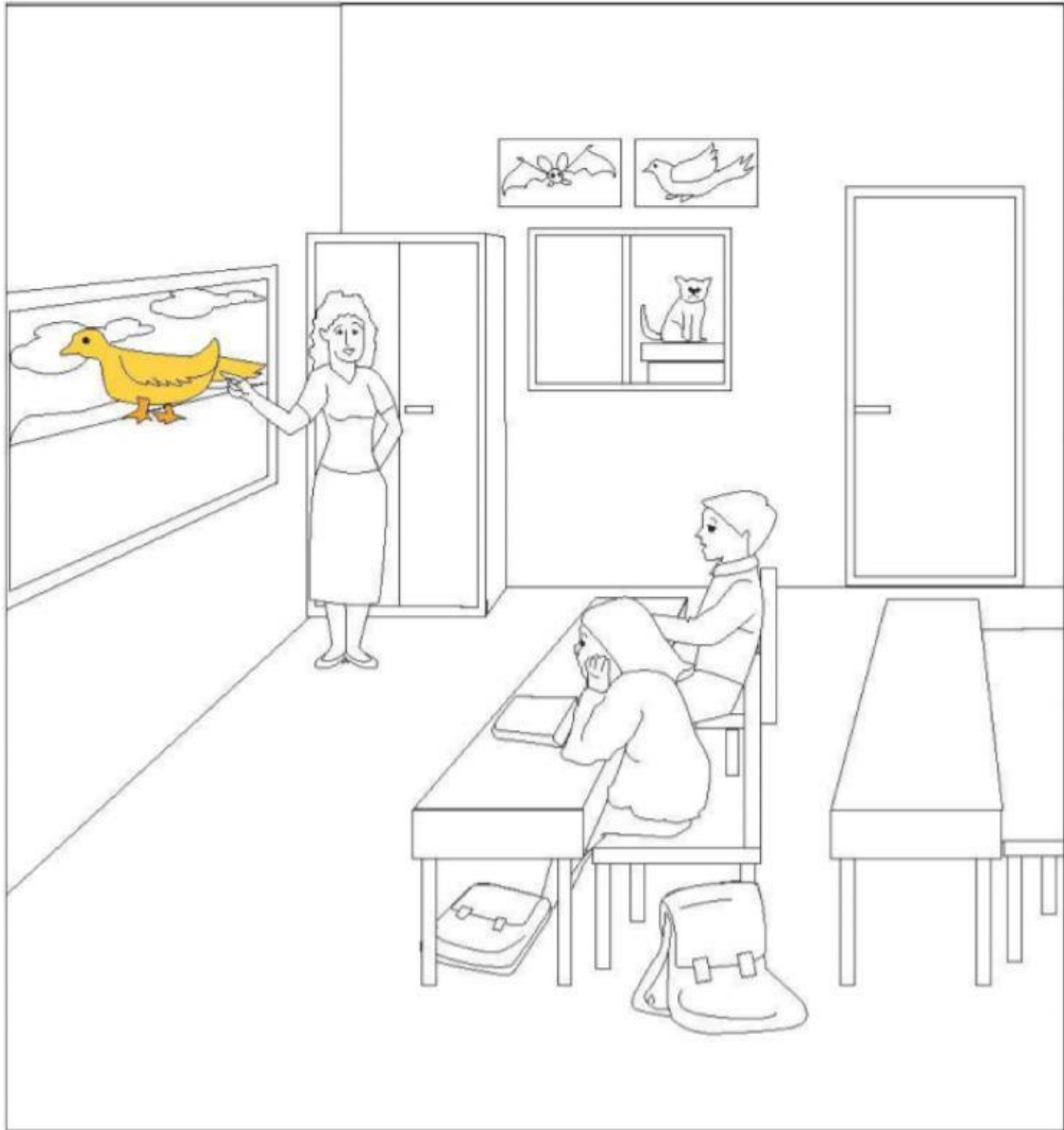
Look at the pictures. Read the sentences and choose the correct words.

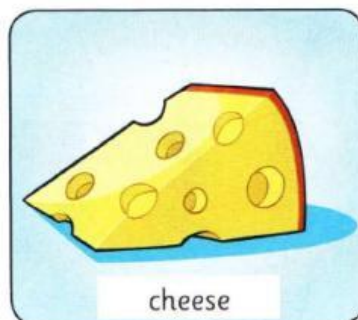
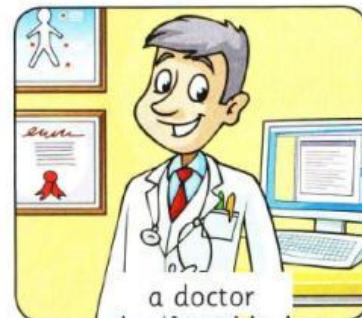
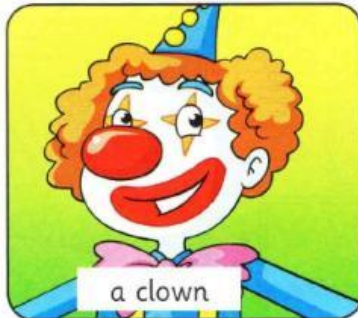
