

Eng 202: Unit 8: lesson4: Passive voice with modals

We use the passive voice to focus on the person/ thing that the action happens to - rather than the person/thing that acts.

Example:

Active: You should trust employees to do their jobs.

Passive: Employees should be trusted to do their jobs.

Modals	- Can / could/ may/ might/will/ would/shall/ should/ must. Semi modals: Used to/ have to/ need to.
The rule	- Modal or semi modal +be+ past participle. - Example: The team should be given more responsibilities.
Usage	- We use modals to show if we believe something is certain, possible or impossible: examples: - My key must be in the car. - It might rain tomorrow. - I used to get up early when I was a student.
