4. Be the Teacher: Spot the Mistake! 🧑🏫

Answer:
Mistake 1: You cannot use a specific past time ('yesterday') with the present perfect. Mistake 2: The past participle of 'go' is 'gone', not 'went'. Correct sentence: "I went to the park yesterday." OR "I have gone to the park."

Answer:
The helper verb 'have' is incorrect for the subject 'He'. It should be 'has'. Correct sentence: "He has just bought a new car."
