Student A:

Student B:

Student A:

Student B:

I see your point, but I don't really agree that it is too much. Maybe it just needs better time management.

Student A:

Hmm, I respect your opinion, but I still think it is too heavy for one day.

Student B:

I partly agree, but I think homework helps us understand the lesson better.

Student A:

That's true. I agree with that idea, but the amount should be balanced.

Student B:

Yes, I completely agree. Balance is important so students don't feel stressed.

Questions

1. Student B agrees that the homework is too much at the beginning of the dialogue.
2. The sentence "*I see your point, but I don't really agree...*" shows disagreement.
3. Student A fully agrees with Student B when saying "*I respect your opinion...*".
4. The expression "*I partly agree...*" shows a form of agreement.
5. At the end of the dialogue, both students agree about the importance of balance.
