Electric Vehicles: The Future of Transportation

Electric vehicles (EVs) are becoming more popular around the world. In 2023, global EV sales reached over 10 million units, marking a significant increase from previous years. Many car companies, such as Tesla, Nissan, and Ford, **Q29.1**..... These vehicles do not run on gasoline but on electricity, which reduces greenhouse gas emissions and helps protect the environment.

One of the main reasons for the shift to EVs is the growing concern about pollution. Traditional cars produce a lot of carbon dioxide, contributing about 14% of global emissions from transportation in 2021. **Q29.2**..... This makes them a cleaner alternative for the planet.

Governments are also supporting the move to electric vehicles. The United States government passed a law in 2022 that provides up to \$7,500 in tax credits for EV buyers. **Q29.3**..... Countries are also investing in charging infrastructure to make EVs more convenient.

Although electric vehicles are still more expensive than regular cars, prices are expected to drop by 2025. Many experts believe that by 2030, electric cars will dominate the market, which will lead to a significant reduction in pollution and **Q29.4**.....
