Living in big cities offers many advantages, but it also comes with serious problems. One issue that affects millions of city residents is noise pollution. Unlike air or water pollution, noise pollution is often ignored, yet it has significant effects on people's health and quality of life.

City noise comes from many sources. Traffic is the biggest problem - cars, buses, motorcycles, and trucks create constant sound throughout the day and night. Construction sites with their loud machines add to the problem. Factories, airports, and even neighbors playing loud music all contribute to the **relentless** noise that fills urban areas. In some neighborhoods, people cannot have a quiet moment even in their own homes. The sounds never stop, continuing from early morning until late at night.

The effects of noise pollution are serious. Studies show that people living in noisy areas have more stress, sleep problems, and heart disease. Children in noisy schools find it harder to concentrate and learn. Workers in loud environments become tired and less productive. Many city dwellers feel exhausted and anxious because they cannot find peace and quiet.

Some cities are taking action to **limit** this problem. They create quiet zones near hospitals and schools where loud noises are not allowed. They plant more trees along streets because trees can absorb sound. Some cities also make rules about construction hours and limit traffic in certain areas. However, solving noise pollution requires cooperation from everyone - government, businesses, and citizens must work together to make cities quieter and healthier places to live.
