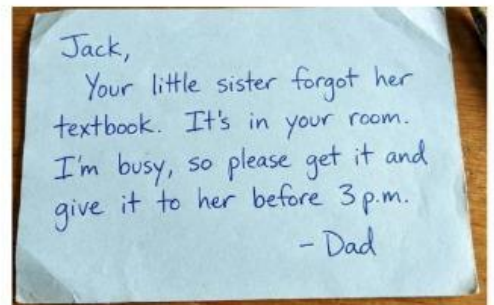

Many students today face **mounting** pressure to succeed in school. They worry about grades, tests, and getting into good universities. This stress affects their daily lives in many ways.

Academic pressure comes from different sources. Parents often want their children to do well and have better opportunities than they had. Teachers expect students to work hard and meet high standards. Friends and classmates also create pressure when students compare their grades and achievements with others.

The effects of too much academic pressure can be serious. Students may feel tired all the time and have trouble sleeping. Some lose interest in activities they once enjoyed. They might feel anxious or sad, and their health can suffer. When pressure becomes too intense, students may even experience burnout - a state of physical and mental exhaustion.

However, not all pressure is bad. A reasonable amount of challenge can **motivate** students to learn and improve. The key is finding balance. Students need time to study, but they also need time to relax, exercise, and spend time with family and friends. Schools and parents should help create an environment where students can succeed without sacrificing their well-being.
