Billie Jean King

Billie Jean King is a tennis legend whose achievements on court include 39 Grand Slam titles. In addition, she ¹ (fight) for equality and social justice for many years.

King won her first Wimbledon championship in 1961, at age 17. In 1968, she turned professional and that meant big prize money. However, at that time, women ² (not earn) as much money as men. Insisting on equal prizes for men and women, King threatened that she ³ (not play) in future tournaments. Her threats ⁴ (must / take) seriously because at the next US Open, both men and women players ⁵ (offer) the same amount of prize money.

Despite King's outstanding tennis career, she ⁶ (remember) best for beating Bobby Riggs in the famous Battle of the Sexes match in 1973. The 55-year-old Riggs, ⁷ had been the 1939 Wimbledon champion, claimed that he ⁸ still (can / beat) any woman player.
