By 7 a.m., the team had already checked the weather forecast, prepared the equipment and planned the safest route. At that time, Carmen was still driving to the meeting point.

When she arrived, the group leader gave everyone a short briefing. He explained that a cyclist had reported an injured fox near the river the previous evening, but nobody had found it yet. Because of that, the team needed to search the area carefully and quietly. Laia listened closely because she had recently completed an online first aid course for animals and wanted to be useful.

During the search, Carmen noticed fresh tracks in the mud. While two volunteers were checking the riverbank, she followed the tracks for a few metres and called the others. A few minutes later, they found the fox hiding under a fallen tree. It looked weak, but it was still breathing normally. The team contacted a local wildlife vet, who said he would be arriving in about twenty minutes.

By the time the vet reached the area, the volunteers had created a quiet space around the animal and had kept curious walkers away. The vet examined the fox and said it would probably recover well. Before the team left, the group leader thanked Carmen for staying calm and paying attention to detail. On the way home, she thought about the day and realised that she was getting used to making quick decisions in stressful situations.
