3. How do I go from the playground to the police station?

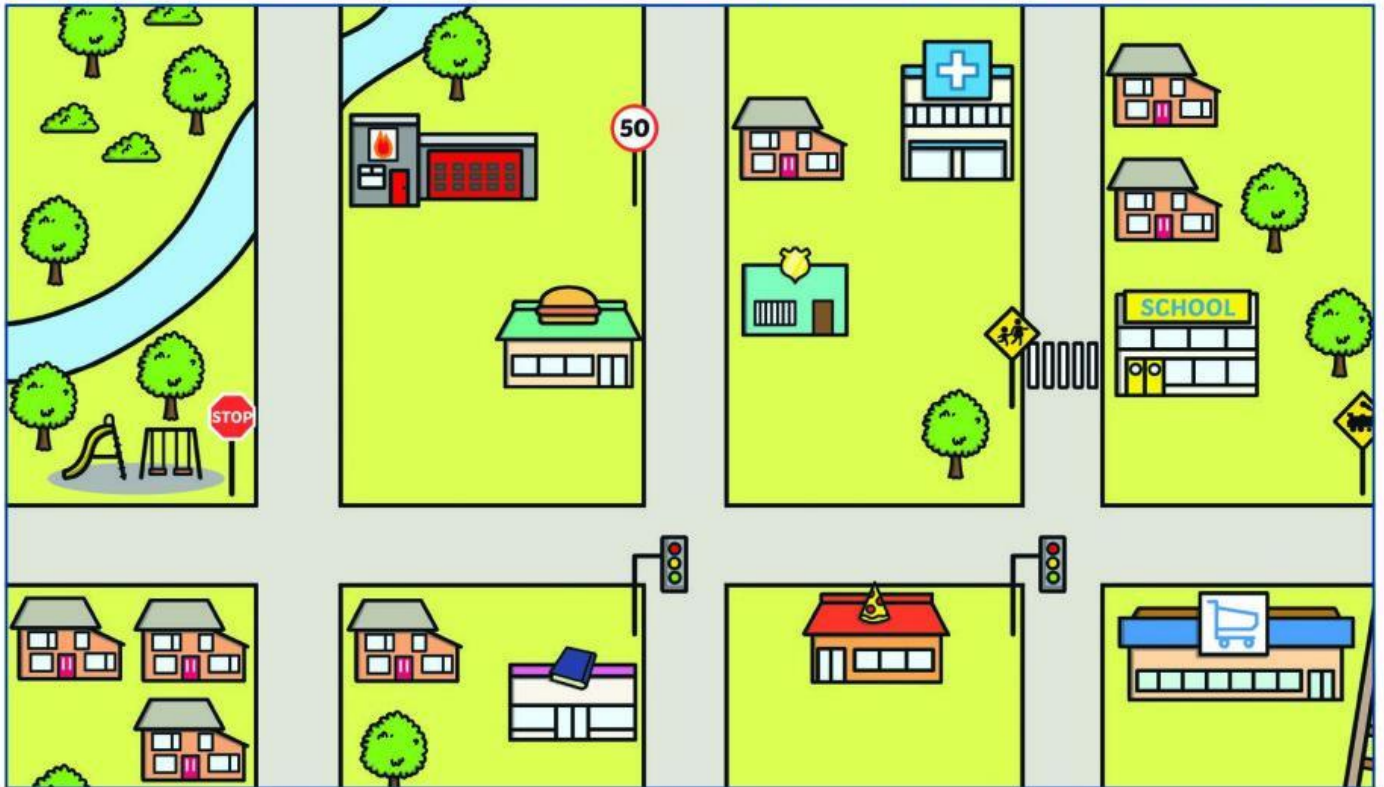
4. How do I go from the hamburger restaurant to the supermarket?
