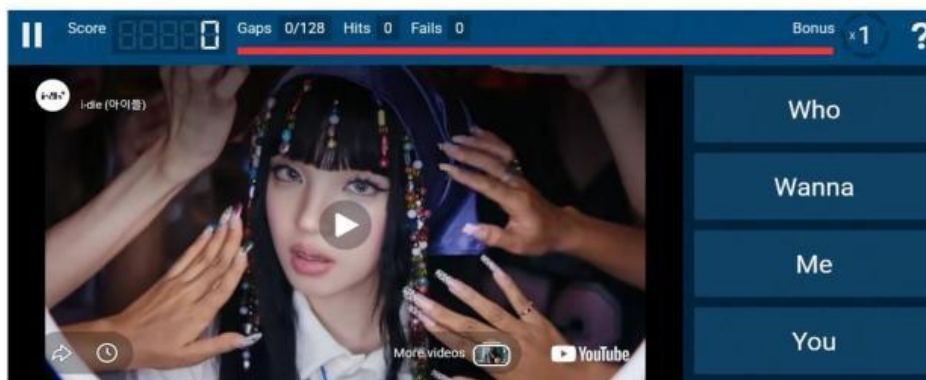
Mission 6: Our spy's favourite song in the playlist

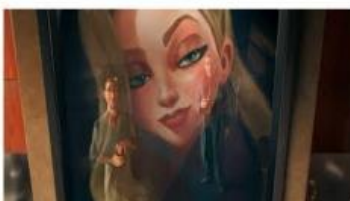
