Screens, Streets, and Simple Joys

Every evening, in millions of homes across Vietnam, a familiar scene takes place. Teenagers sit alone in their rooms, scrolling through short videos or chatting with friends online. Meanwhile, their

grandparents sit quietly outside, watching the sky turn orange. Today, young people spend a large part of their leisure time on electronic devices, and this has quietly changed the way they connect with the people around them.

This shift is happening everywhere, even in the countryside, where life once moved more slowly. Rural life used to give young people a strong sense of belonging. They learned local customs, joined traditional festivals, and heard stories from their elders. But as screens become more **pervasive**, these daily rituals are fading. Perhaps the most important thing young people can do is look back before they look forward. Vietnamese culture has always valued community, family bonds, and a slower kind of joy. These are not old-fashioned ideas. They are, in many ways, timeless. The future will bring more technology and faster communication, but the wisdom to use them well may come from remembering that a shared meal or a walk through a familiar street can still be the most **enriching** experience of all.
