Overtourism: Too Many Visitors

Tourism can be a positive force for local communities. It generates jobs, supports small businesses, and helps protect cultural heritage. Yet many famous destinations are now struggling with overtourism—a situation where visitor numbers become so high that they harm the environment and disrupt local life.

Venice, Barcelona, and Bali clearly show how serious this issue can be. In Venice, massive cruise ships deliver thousands of tourists daily, leaving streets packed and making it hard for residents to move around.

In Barcelona, many locals say they can no longer afford the city center because hotels and short-term rentals have pushed housing costs up. Constant crowds and noise undermine residents' well-being.

The environment also pays a heavy price. Popular beaches are often littered with rubbish. Historic buildings and monuments are damaged when millions of visitors touch or climb on them. Natural landscapes lose their charm when they are degraded by excessive foot traffic. In some places, coral reefs have even been destroyed by careless tourists stepping on them or polluting the water.

To tackle this problem, many destinations are taking steps to manage tourism. Some limit daily visitor numbers, while others introduce entrance fees to control crowds and fund conservation. These measures can protect valuable places for future generations and help communities reduce the harmful effects of mass tourism.
