In January 2024, a series of earthquakes hit the Noto Peninsula in Japan. More than 200 people died and thousands of homes fell down. Roads broke apart, and some villages could not be reached for many days. Help was slow to arrive. Japan is well known as a place where earthquakes happen often, because of where it sits on the Earth. But many people were still shocked by how fast the damage spread.

Natural disasters like earthquakes, floods, and storms are happening more often in many parts of the world. Two main reasons explain this. First, more people are now living in areas that are easy to flood or shake, especially in big cities near the sea. Second, the weather is changing. Storms are getting stronger, rain is getting heavier, and the sea level is rising. When a disaster hits, countries with less money find it harder to get ready and to recover.

Even so, people often show great strength after a disaster. In Japan, neighbours helped each other with food and warm clothes before any official help came. In Vietnam, local volunteers were some of the first to arrive after Typhoon Yagi hit the north in September 2024. Experts call this "**resilience**", the ability of normal people to stay strong and keep going when things fall apart. It does not replace good planning or government help. But in the hardest hours, it is often the people around us, not big systems, that hold everything together. Some researchers also warn that without better care for the environment, disasters will become even more **devastating** in the years ahead.
