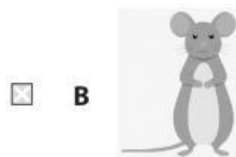
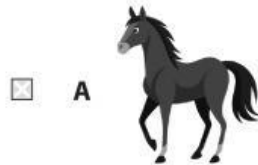



High Energy

Jobs to do with fitness, sleep and healthy eating are all part of the wellness industry.
