5 Complete the text about British students' school chores using *have to / has to / don't have to / doesn't have to*.

All boys and girls in the UK (0) have to go to school until the age of 16. There are state schools and independent schools. If you choose a state school, you (1) pay for it.

Pupils usually have to wear a uniform. Sometimes boys and girls (2) wear a school tie. In Northern Ireland at the age of 11 you (3) have a test. If you fail it, you can't study where you want to. In Scotland you (4) take such a test. In secondary school pupils (5) learn at least one foreign language. Each UK school has its own timetable; lessons may last 35, 45 or 60 minutes. Children (6) study English, maths, history, geography and science. For each subject a pupil (7) attend classes for about 5 hours a week. They also (8) spend time doing physical education or sport every week. School term dates are different across the UK. For example, in Scotland children (9) start school in August.

The rules are quite strict. If a pupil breaks a rule, they (10) stay at school for some time after classes. It is called 'detention'.
