How to be a safe and smart searcher? Here are some useful tips.

**Several keywords will help to find better results.** Use more than one keyword when you search. If you want to find out about seagulls, for example, search for 'bird seagull' and not just 'seagull' – because seagull might also be the name of anything else.

**Avoid common words like 'a' or 'the' in a search.** These aren't always helpful and are usually unnecessary.

**Remove unwanted results by adding a minus symbol (-).** For example, 'seagull - hotel - film' would leave out all results related to hotels and films.

**Check your spelling.** Make sure that you spell every word in the search box correctly. The smallest typing mistakes can bring unwanted results.

**Have a filter.** It's a good idea to filter your online searches, especially for pictures. Ask an adult to help you add a filtering system.

**Exactness is important when you search on the Internet.** Always ask yourself, 'Is this reliable?' Don't make the mistake of believing everything you see. Some websites are unreliable and some information is false. Check your information before accepting it.
