When people hear the name Spider-Man, they often think of Peter Parker. He is the famous young man who swings between tall buildings, saves people in danger, and wears a red and blue suit. However, Spider-Man: Into the Spider-Verse tells the story of another hero: Miles Morales.

Miles is a teenager from Brooklyn, New York. He is smart, creative, and a little unsure of himself. At the beginning of the film, Miles has just started studying at a new school. It is a good school, but it is also difficult for him. He misses his old friends, and he does not always feel that he belongs there. At home, his father wants him to work hard and follow the rules, while Miles wants more freedom to be himself.

One day, Miles goes to a quiet underground place with his uncle Aaron. Miles enjoys art, especially graffiti, and this place gives him space to express himself. But something strange happens there. A special spider bites him. Soon after that, Miles begins to notice some very unusual changes. He can stick to walls, move more quickly, and sense danger before it happens. At first, these new powers are not exciting for him. They are confusing and frightening.

Miles soon discovers that he is not the only Spider-Man. A dangerous machine has opened the door between different universes. Because of this, several Spider-People arrive in Miles's world. Some are serious, some are funny, and some are very different from the Spider-Man that people usually know. They include an older and tired Peter Parker, a brave Spider-Woman called Gwen Stacy, and other surprising heroes from other worlds.

This makes the film feel fresh and exciting. It is not only a story about fighting villains. It is also a story about identity. Miles looks at these other heroes and wonders if he can ever be like them. They already know how to use their powers, but Miles is still learning. He makes mistakes. He feels afraid. Sometimes, he thinks he is not ready.

The main danger comes from Kingpin, a powerful man who wants to use the machine for his own personal reason. However, the machine is not safe. If it continues to work, it may destroy Miles's city and hurt many people. Miles and the other Spider-People must find a way to stop it before it is too late.

What makes Into the Spider-Verse special is the way it shows that being a hero does not mean being perfect. Miles does not become Spider-Man in one easy moment. He has to learn, fall, try again, and believe in himself. The film also looks like a moving comic book, with bright colours, fast action, and creative visual effects. Every scene feels full of energy.

In the end, the film invites the audience to ask an important question: What makes someone a real hero? Is it the suit, the powers, or the courage to keep going when things are difficult? For Miles Morales, becoming Spider-Man is not just about saving the world. It is about discovering who he is and choosing to take a brave step forward.
