Living on a boat

I'm an actor and I decided to move to London last year because the theatres around the centre are where it's easiest for me to find work. I rented a flat for six months, but it was very expensive. I wanted to live here, but I knew I'd never be able to buy a house. Then I heard about houseboats. I loved the idea of making my home on a boat – cooking, watching TV and sleeping on the river just sounded amazing.

Before buying my houseboat, I spent six months learning about them. That helped me decide what kind of houseboat was right for me. It's important to plan how to use the space on the boat. And then there's the practical side of things – how to heat your boat and water, for example. There's a lot to think about and there are lots of boats to choose from, so talking to friends was really useful.

People ask me if living on a boat's difficult. I don't think it is. My boat has lots of small windows, so it's not dark inside. The heating system's really good too, so winter's not a problem. I can't keep all my coats, jackets and shoes with me, however. I've had to send some back to my parents' house, which is a real shame.

There are different places in London where houseboats like mine are allowed to stay. I have to move my houseboat to a new place every two weeks. I actually enjoy this because I discover different parts of the city and meet new people. People who live on boats are a very friendly group. Having to move when the weather's wet or windy is hard work, but I'm getting used to it.

If you're thinking about buying a houseboat in London, think carefully about the size of the boat. The water's busier now than in the past, so a smaller boat will be easier to keep in the centre of the city. And remember also that there's a lot to learn! Don't get upset if things go wrong – they will but they'll soon get better. There will always be someone to help you!
