Tourism is often seen as a positive force that brings economic growth and cultural exchange, but it can also cause serious harm to many destinations. When too many visitors come to one place, the natural environment, local culture, and infrastructure may suffer. Instead of improving life for local people, tourism can sometimes **destroy** the very beauty that attracts travellers in the first place.

Over time, the pressure from mass tourism can damage both nature and culture. Forests may be cut down to build hotels, beaches may be polluted with plastic waste, and wildlife can lose their habitats.
