Everyone has a favorite kind of movie. But what kinds of movies are the most popular? A look at the list of the top money-making movies of all time provides some information about the most popular genres.

These movies use adventure, excitement, and sometimes violence to attract people.

There's only one animated film in the top-ten list. At number five, it's *Frozen*.

And here's something interesting:

Some of the movies on the top-ten list have hilarious parts, but none of the movies are comedies. The list also does not include any horror films, documentaries, or musicals.
