

MODAL VERBS: MUST, HAVE TO, MUSTN'T, DON'T/ DOESN'T HAVE TO.

Remember:

Have to and must are used for obligations:

For example: She **has to** clean her room in the morning. / We **have to** wear a uniform for school
Visitors **must** show their tickets at the entrance.

Mustn't is used for prohibitions.

For example: We **mustn't** feed the animals at the zoo.

Don't/Doesn't have to shows something isn't necessary to do.

For example: He **doesn't have to** cook. (His mum does it) / We **don't have to** go to school on Sundays.






