	Full form / short form
I	am / 'm playing
You	are / 're playing
He / She / It	is / 's playing
We / You / They	are / 're playing

Spelling variations

- 1 For most verbs we add **-ing** to the base form.
 play + **-ing** = playing
 walk + **-ing** = walking
- 2 However, there are some spelling variations:
 - verbs ending in **-e**. Drop the **-e** and add **-ing**.
 have → having
 - short verbs ending in a vowel plus a consonant. Double the final consonant and add **-ing**.
 sit → sitting

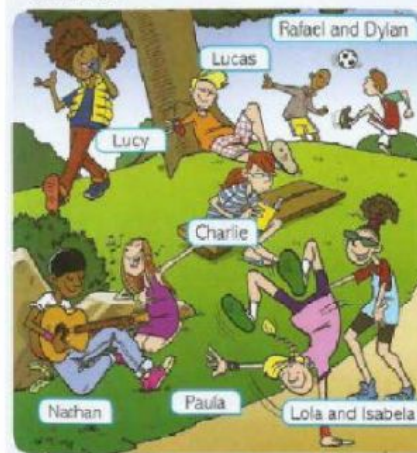
