Firstly, passwords are important for keeping the network secure. Don't use common words or numbers as passwords, such as birthdays or names of your children. Passwords must be alphanumeric and be at least eight characters long. You need to change your password every month or more frequently. Also, you should not share it with anyone, including your colleagues.

_____ Once connected, look at the sticker on the back of the router to find its default IP address and login credentials.

_____ Before you begin, plug the router into your modem using an Ethernet cable and power it on.

_____ At the end of the configuration, click "Save and Apply", and the router will reboot to activate your secure network.

_____ After updating the admin details, look for the "Wireless Settings" section to name your network (SSID).

_____ First, connect your computer to the router using either a temporary network cable or the default Wi-Fi password.

_____ Inside the wireless settings, make sure to select WPA3 encryption and create a strong password for your Wi-Fi.
