

Fires, floods, tornadoes and other natural disasters can be good opportunities for criminals. They know people often leave their homes quickly and leave many of their possessions behind.

In August 2005, there was a big hurricane in the USA. Around 1.5 million people from Alabama, Mississippi and Louisiana left their homes before the hurricane started. According to police officers, there were nearly 1,000 criminal incidents during the hurricane. While people were trying to get to a safe place, criminals were stealing possessions from their homes. This also happened in Colorado during the Waldo Canyon forest fire in 2012. The police reported 42 home robberies in 10 days.

After the tsunami in Thailand in 2004, there were reports of gang crime and robberies. In one particular case, criminals put on police uniforms and went into hotels around Khao Lak. While the real police officers were solving crimes, the other "police officers" were stealing clothes, money, documents and other possessions from the victims' hotel rooms.

Of course, the most important thing during a natural disaster is to save your life, but you can protect your possessions, too. For example, you should always keep your important documents in a safe place, so you can find them easily and take them with you. You should also close your doors and turn on any security devices, like alarms or home cameras. That way, even in a disaster, you can return home afterwards, keeping you, your family and all your possessions safe.
