



THE WORLD CUP: PAST CONTINUOUS



We use Past Continuous to talk about actions that were **in progress** at a specific time in the past.

FORM:

WAS / WERE + VERB (verb + ing)

I / He / She / It → **was** + verb-ing

You / We / They → **were** + verb-ing

EXAMPLES:

- ⚽ I **was watching** the World Cup match yesterday at 6 p.m.
- ⚽ They **were celebrating** a goal when I called them.
- ⚽ He **was playing** football while his brother **was studying**.

While the world was watching, history was being written.
