A Film Club Surprise

Last Friday, our school film club watched *Midnight Station*, a new science-fiction film. I nearly didn't go because science fiction is not usually my favourite movie genre. I often prefer comedies or heart-warming dramas about family life. Also, the trailer for *Midnight Station* showed flying cars, robots and bright lights, so I expected a noisy film with too many special effects and not much story.

However, I was wrong. The film setting was a huge city in the future, where most people travelled by train through the sky. The eye-catching visuals were impressive, but they did not feel unnecessary. They helped show how lonely the city was, even though it was full of people. The soundtrack was also excellent. In the quiet scenes, the music made the city feel cold and empty, while in the action scenes it made everything feel more exciting.

The main character, Lina, is a teenage girl who works at a train station at night. At first, she seems ordinary, but she notices that one train arrives every evening with no passengers inside. Her younger brother thinks she is imagining things, but Lina decides to investigate. I liked her because she was brave but not perfect. She made mistakes, and sometimes she was scared, which made her feel real.

My favourite character was actually a supporting character called Leo, an old ticket seller. At the beginning, I thought he was only there to make jokes, but he slowly became important to the story. The strong acting made his scenes very believable. He helped Lina understand that the mystery was connected to the history of the city, not just to the strange train.

The plot was fast-paced in some parts, especially when Lina followed the empty train, but it also had slower scenes where the characters talked about memory, family and courage. Some students in my class thought those scenes were too quiet, but I liked them. They made the story more thought-provoking.

Near the end, there was a clever plot twist. I won't say exactly what happened, but it changed the way I understood the whole film. It also showed that the plot was well-written because small details from earlier scenes suddenly became important. The ending was not perfect, but it was emotional and hopeful.

In the end, I'm glad I watched *Midnight Station*. It was not just a film with exciting technology. It had a gripping story, strong acting and a message that stayed with me after I left the room. I think it is definitely worth watching, even for people who do not usually choose science-fiction films.
