

## Imperatives

Type	Rule	Example
1. Affirmative [ + ]	Base Verb	You <b>open</b> the door. → <b>Open</b> the door. You <b>are</b> on time. → <b>Be</b> on time.
2. Negative [ - ]	Don't + Base Verb	You <b>don't</b> run. → <b>Don't</b> run. You <b>are</b> late. → <b>Don't be</b> late.
