In Thai, the word “wattanatham” (culture) comes from two words: “wattana” which means growth and prosperity, and “tham” which refers to action or practice. So, culture means the actions that lead to growth. According to the National Culture Act, culture includes ways of life, thoughts, beliefs, values, norms, customs, rituals and wisdom that are created, learned, improved, and passed on peacefully and sustainably.

Ways of life refers to Thai people’s lifestyle from birth to death, including the four requisites: shelter, food, clothing and medicine, as well as social knowledge and behavior.

Wisdom is knowledge and skills developed over time through thinking, selection, improvement, and transfer. Thai wisdom is outstanding in many areas, such as agriculture, arts, literature and language.
