## Getting a Coffee

In this activity, you'll read two dialogues about ordering and paying for coffee. The sentences are mixed up. Your job is to put the sentences in the correct order by writing the correct numbers in the boxes. At the end, you will practice ordering coffee with a partner using a coffee menu.



## Dialogue 1: Ordering and Paying at a Coffee Shop

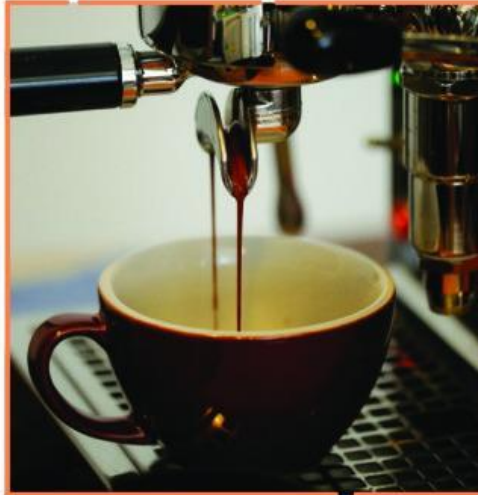
In this dialogue, someone is ordering a cappuccino at a coffee shop.

- To take away, please.
- Hi, can I have a cappuccino, please?
- What size would you like? Small, medium, or large?
- Can I pay by card?
- Regular milk, please.
- What kind of milk would you like—regular, oat, or almond?
- Medium, please.
- Thanks. Could I get a receipt, please?
- Of course. Would you like it for here or to take away?
- Yes, of course. Just tap your card here.
- That's £3.70, please.
- Here you go. Have a nice day!
- Thanks very much. You too!

## Ordering a Coffee



### Dialogue 2: Ordering an Americano at a Café

In this dialogue, someone is ordering a simple drink and paying with cash.

- Sure, is that for here or to take away?
- Hi, can I get an Americano, please?
- No, just black, please.
- Would you like any milk with that?
- For here, please.
- Thanks. Could I get a napkin as well, please?
- That will be £3.00, please.
- Of course. Enjoy your coffee!
- Can I pay with cash?
- Thanks a lot. Have a good day!
- Yes, no problem. Here's your change.
