1. Review of Verb Patterns

a) Verb + Infinitive

Some verbs are followed by **to + infinitive**.

Structure: Verb + to + base verb

Examples: I tend **to choose** practical clothes.

b) Verb + Object + Infinitive

Structure: Verb + object + to + base verb

Examples: Fashion magazines inspire people **to try** new styles.

c) Verb + Gerund

Structure: Verb + verb-ing

Examples: I enjoy **wearing** comfortable clothes.

d) Verb + Object + Preposition + Gerund

Structure: Verb + object + preposition + verb-ing

Examples: High prices prevent people from **buying** luxury brands

2. Cleft Sentences with What

We use **what + clause + be + information** to emphasize an idea.

Normal Sentence

Quality is important to me.

Examples: What I value most is comfort.

Cleft Sentence

What is important to me is quality.
