Because /t/ and /d/ sounds have other **consonants/vowels** around them. We call this a consonant group.

4. Do /t/ and /d/ sounds always disappear when they are in a consonant group? Not always, but usually when someone speaks **fast/slow** and in **friendly/serious** conversations.

REMEMBER!

LISTENING TIP 1: Expect **to hear/ not to hear** the /t/ and /d/ sounds at the end of words if they are in a consonant group.
