- 1 **C**
The core safety rule is to stay in one place; this prevents getting further lost and makes it easier for a parent to return to that spot.
-
- 2 **A, B, C, D**
According to safety procedures, a child needs to provide their name, parent's name, parent's phone number in English, and a description of the parent's appearance (including clothing) so the helper can locate the parent.
-
- 3 **False**
Running around makes it harder for the parent to find the child and increases the risk of getting even more lost. The rule is to stay in one place.
-
- 4 **True**
This is the basic definition used in stranger danger education. Anyone that the child has not met before is a stranger.
-
- 5 **False**
The correct response is a firm 'No, thank you' and staying in the safety spot. Accepting the offer could lead to danger.
-
- 6 **No, thank you!**
This firm reply is the standard safety phrase to decline offers from strangers while remaining polite.
-
- 7 **I don't know you.**
Asserting 'I don't know you' reinforces boundaries and reminds the stranger that the child is not to be approached.
-
- 8 **Hair**
Describing the parent's hair or current clothing helps identify them in a crowd.
-
- 9 **1 → A stay**
2 → B run
3 → A security
Staying still avoids getting further lost. Security guards in uniform are safe helpers.
-
- 10 **1 → B No**
2 → A know
3 → B safety spot
The correct response is 'No, thank you' and 'I don't know you', while remaining in a safe location.
-
- 11 **B**
Safety guidelines specify describing the parent's hair (or physical appearance) and current clothing.
-
- 12 **B**
The child should not trust the stranger's claim; instead they should refuse and remain in their safety spot.
-
- 13 **B**
Staying put increases the chances that the parent will find the child by retracing steps.
-
- 14 **False**
The essential information includes name, parent's name, parent's phone number, and description of parent, but not the child's home address.

- 15 **False**
The child should not engage; they should use firm refusals and boundary statements.

16 Stand still / stay in one place.

This is the foundational rule to avoid getting further lost.

17 Security guard uniform.

Security guards are identifiable by their uniform and are designated helpers.

18 1 → A phone

2 → A wearing

Phone number in English and description of clothing and hair are key details.

19 B

Strangers may lie; the child should not trust any claim and should stick to the safety response.

20 C

The required information includes name, parent's name, phone number, and description, not email.
