CONDITIONAL SENTENCE AND FCE WRITING

A. THEORY

1. Grammar: Third conditional (Câu điều kiện loại 3)

- Câu điều kiện loại 3 sử dụng để diễn tả **tình huống giả định trong quá khứ**.

Về điều kiện	Về kết quả		Examples
If + S + had (not) + V _{3/ed} ,	S + would have + V _{3/ed} .	kết quả chắc chắn (không xảy ra)	If I had seen you there, I would have invited you to dinner.
	S + could have + V _{3/ed} .	kết quả có thể xảy ra	If I had had enough money, I could have bought the phone.
	S + might have + V _{3/ed} .	kết quả không chắc chắn	If I had played better, I might have won .

- Thứ tự của các mệnh đề có thể **hoán đổi** cho nhau.

E.g. We **would have gone** for the picnic yesterday **if** the weather **had not been** rainy.

- Sử dụng **if only** cùng **quá khứ hoàn thành** để nói về điều mà ta **ước mình đã làm trong quá khứ** (nhưng thực tế đã không làm).

If only + S + had (not) + V _{3/ed} ,	S + would/could/might have + V _{3/ed} .	If only she hadn't told the police, everything would have been all right.

A hop, skip and a jump away

Audrey Pirog talks about her first triple-jump competition

“I want you to warm up. Do some bounding on the grass while you wait to sign in.” It was Paula, our coach. I was not very keen on this idea because I thought it would only make me tired. My three fellow triple-jumpers and I looked at each other. We all silently agreed because we wanted to save our energy. Nobody moved. More importantly, I needed to qualify for the state championships. It was the only thing I could think about. I had to jump twenty-nine feet, six inches to do this.

I stretched them and felt a lump in my left leg, the remains of a pulled muscle. When I heard my name, I began to feel nervous. What if I did not make it? This was my last chance to qualify, and I only had three jumps. I bounced on my toes while I watched the girls before me jump. By studying their form, I could see who had not gained enough speed from the board.

Finally, my turn came. I stepped onto the runway and found my chalk mark. I calmed myself, narrowed my eyes and took a deep breath. Pushing off with my back foot, I ran forward into a sprint. One, two, three, four, five, and then six strides. I was on the board. The actual jump was difficult to remember: a one-legged hop, a skip and a long jump into the hot sand pit. I breathed out as I stepped out of the pit and waited to hear my result. “Twenty-eight feet, five and a half inches,” said the man with the clipboard.

I walked down the runway and Paula met me with a kind expression. “I want you to try something. Where is a relaxing place for you?” “In the water, I suppose. Swimming,” I said. It was the first idea that came into my mind, and I did not realise how silly it might sound. “Perfect,” she replied. “Just before you jump, imagine that you are in the water, floating.” I agreed and smiled to show that I appreciated her help. I walked around until my name was called again.

“Pirog, you’re up!” I closed my eyes and imagined water running over me and calming me. My muscles relaxed, and I breathed out as I ran towards the board. This run felt light and free. When I took off from the second board, I was sure that my first phase was too high, my second phase was too short, and my landing was not as good as it should have been. I stood up and shook off the sand while the officials used the long measuring tape. The wait felt unbearable.

“Twenty-nine feet, ten inches!” I could not stop myself from screaming and jumping into the air. My teammates rushed towards me and surrounded me. Soon, my hand hurt from all the usual high-fives. I felt relieved that I had finally done it, and I knew my success was not simply due to luck. My face hurt from smiling, but I knew I would not stop. I found Paula and ran to hug her. “That was all thanks to you!” I said. She smiled and replied, “Thank the water.”
