Each year, people leave many things on London trains and buses: umbrellas, mobile phones, keys, clothes and toys. Staff find <sup>1</sup>..... things and send them to the Transport for London Lost Property Office. About a thousand things arrive <sup>2</sup>..... each day. So, what happens to <sup>3</sup>.....?
