Rule	Comparative	Superlative
Sentence rule	Compare <u>two</u> things. eg. A rabbit is <u>faster</u> <u>than</u> a turtle.	Compare <u>three or more</u> things eg. The snail is <u>the</u> <u>slowest</u> animal.
Spelling Rule	1. + er eg. tall -> taller 2. - y + ier eg. heavy -> heavier 3. Double consonant + er eg. big -> bigger 4.
