Present Perfect: actions connected to the present, life experiences, recent results.

Example: The band has released six albums.

Present Perfect Continuous: actions continuing over a period of time.

Example: They have been using social media for years.

Adverbs:

Simple Past: afterwards, later, the next day, when, as soon as.

Past Perfect: before that, until then, by the time, previously.
